Trail Assessments and Repair

- Strategy 1: Ensure communication and coordination with trail partner organizations.
- Strategy 2: Identify and develop agreements and tools to support effective partnering.
- Strategy 3: Leverage partner and volunteer interest to assist with assessments, skills training, and trail repair work and build long-term trail stewardship capacity.
- Strategy 4: Work with partners to coordinate volunteer engagement.
- Strategy 5: Ensure interagency coordination regarding trail repair and opening strategy; safety considerations; and field work in support of the trail repair effort.
- Strategy 6: Prepare for increase in visitor use at trails and recreation areas on the Washington side of the Gorge.

- Switchback impacted by rockslide




- Steep unstable conditions
